

GLOBAL MAY DAY International Workers Day!

This year IWW Ireland participated with other revolutionary unions across the world as part of the **Global May Day** events and actions, to help promote our international solidarity as a union. As part of this international event different IWW areas took part in a series of actions to promote the idea of **Global May Day (GMD)** on International Workers Day, 1st May.

As part of the annual call to action, our union helped organise events on the local and regional level. Here in Ireland local areas took part in a number of banner drops, street exhibitions and street art. Street actions such as sticker/postering, as well as our online music event in conjunction with IWW Scotland.



Banner-drops in Galway highlighted much needed solidarity with Debenhams Workers across the country who remain on the picket lines one year on from their initial actions to demand in full, all wages owed to them by Debenhams bosses. One IWW member told Direct Action that "Recent solidarity actions have been seen on the picket lines by the workers themselves as a vital boost to their continuing struggle."



Members of the I.W.W Dublin gathered in town to celebrate international workers day. A spokesperson said "Branch members performed a banner drop beneath the statue of Jim Larkin and distributed flyers on O'connell Street. After that we moved on to Liberty Hall for a picture with fellow wobbly, James Connolly.

"Despite the occasional questioning by passing members of An Garda Síochána, an member of the far-right and a few Covid-deniers giving us hassle, the day passed without incident and was a great opportunity to meet other branch members after so long in lockdown."

IWW May Day Street exhibitions took place this year in both Belfast and Derry as part of planned May Day events organised by several local branches.

This was another way in which we could do some street activity and meet other workers making use of the great May Day weather. One Wobblie member from Derry said that "It made good discussion points during the day as to why the IWW are completely different from that of the 'business unions'.

"We weren't there looking for votes or the cameras to smile at but to remember May Day as a day when we as workers remember our past struggles as well as those to come. For those of us us took part we wanted to highlight ourselves as a fighting union which was created by and for workers, not political parties or paid officials."

MAY DAY ACTION: BOYCOTT DEBENHAMS!



IWW members took part in a solidarity action outside Castle Court in Central Belfast earlier as Debenhams attempted to sell out stock removed from stores across the southern network. A spokesperson for the IWW union in Belfast said "Today's action was a gesture of workers solidarity with Debenhams workers fighting to receive their full redundancy package. Money that is rightfully theirs. We spoke to members of the public since the doors opened in Castle Court in order for everyone to know that their should be know hiding places for those who try to deceive of hoodwink workers.

"The stock on sale at this store was forcibly removed from stores across the South. Gardi and security for KPMG broke pickets to smash and grab stocks to sell off here today despite first paying the former Debenhams workers what is rightfully owed to them.

"No matter what hype and glitter Debenhams put on this 'grand sale' today, we know and now the people of this city know that you can't polish a turd. Those who listened as to why we where taking solidarity action here, quite rightly walked away and decided to spend their money at other stores.

"For ourselves, we know they (Debenhams bosses) received the message loud and clear that Belfast fully supports Debenhams workers demands. From the picket lines in Belfast today, we extend our solidarity to those workers in Galway, Dublin, Cork and Tralee who continue the fight, stay strong. An injury to one is an injury to all!"
