## MIGRATION & WORKPLACE ORGANISING TODAY

Migrant workers in the West are often in some of the most precarious positions in the labour market.

While economies intimately depend upon our labour, we are routinely subjected to poverty wages, labour rights abuses and health & safety violations. The recent immigration law changes proposed by the UK government will only push us deeper into insecurity, and make our lives worse while demanding more of our labour.

We know that governments, businesses and the law will not protect the dignity of migrant workers: history has consistently shown that only the power of organised workers can generate lasting improvements in labour conditions.

Across the UK, the Pan African Workers Association (PAWA) and the Industrial Workers of the World (IWW) have been mobilising with many workers in care, logistics and hospitality to build the power of the working class.

At this event key organisers from PAWA/IWW and the Black and Migrant Workers trade union activists will discuss the organising challenges, strategies and successes they have experienced in the last few years. They will also discuss what the new immigration proposals mean, and how we can collectively organise to improve our lives as migrants.

# IWW SOLIDARITY ACTIONS ON PALESTINE LAND DAY

Members of the Industrial Workers of the World took part in solidarity actions in Belfast and Derry marking Palestine Land Day.

The day of action was used to help highlight the continuing genocide of the Palestinian people but also opposition to the unfolding war across the Middle East by the forces of US imperialism and Zionism.

A representative of the IWW said, "During today's actions we heard a number of speakers who addressed rallies to condemn the ongoing genocide in Palestine and to draw attention to the efforts made to oppose it.



"Community and workplace actions are increasing as part of the Boycott, Divestment and Sanctions (BDS) Movement and have already shown many successful victories.

"As a union, we believe it's vital that each of us participate in the grassroots BDS campaigns. Each of us has a role to play, to get involved however we can as the smallest of victories is having an impact".

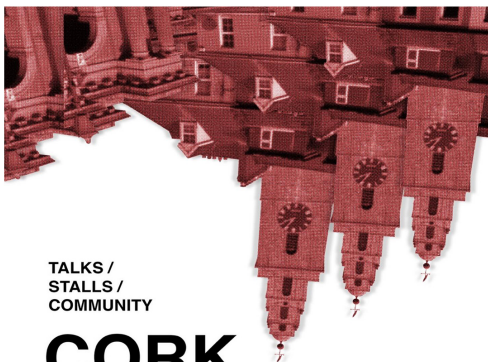
