SOLIDARITY WITH ICELAND WORKERS!

The Industrial Workers of the World extends its solidarity with the Iceland Food Workers. Workers are currently occupying Iceland Food Store in Talbot Street in central Dublin to demand wages and entitlements owed to them by the multinational chain store.

IWW members attended solidarity actions in Dublin held by the IWU Dublin Branch as representatives, family members and supporters rallied to highlight the workers action.

As supporters gathered at the Talbot Street store a spokesperson for the IWW said that "A week on from this initial occupation, when staff at the food chain found out that their bosses effectively terminated posts and attempted to lock them out of their jobs, without any notice or pay owed to them for their labour.


"Yet again we are witnessing greedy bosses effectively shitting on workers following years of dedicated service, such as what we have witnessed with the Debenhams workers recently.

"Without doubt, workers are outraged at the actions of bosses who tried to cut and run once again. Workers are left without wages, without the ability to pay food and fuel bills, or that of rent and mortgages due to being shafted in such a terrible way by cowards. The actions of the Iceland workers are to be commended. Employers cannot be allowed to get away with daylight robbery of workers in this city once again.



"Bosses are robbing workers and they're not even wearing masks. Simply because they are supported and protected by big business, the politicians and their laws."

The IWW support these workers who have taken direct action to demand wages that is rightfully theirs. They are determined to stand their ground until they achieve these goals and are properly compensated. As a union we extend our solidarity with them and their families.

Thank you to for inviting the IWW to speak at their radical alternative to the mainstream pride march last Saturday 24/6.

The IWW could not in good conscience march alongside the Gardaí, government parties, or the corporations that oppress the working class daily.

Below is the text of the speech read by one of our members:

We are standing with you today at this Pride event because it is right to stand with others when they are being victimised, maligned, lied about, and used for political ends. It's right to stand against systems that oppress and abuse.

There is a long proud history of solidarity between the queer communities and workers' unions.

We support one another, not just where we are queer and you are workers, but because we believe in the power of solidarity. Of unity. That an injury to one is an injury to all. We believe that we struggle against the same foe, and so there are no workers' rights without queer rights, without sex worker rights, without migrant rights, without women's rights.

The only hope of the controlling class is to destroy our unity. They are always in search of scapegoats to create disharmony in our communities. They will tell us lies about one group or another, lie that our neighbours are dangerous, are out to get us, are conspiring against us, when they are migrants, or people of colour, or queer, or trans.

Anything to sow distrust and divide us, to keep people from coming together in a struggle against them.

Because they know that together we will win!


Anything to sow distrust and divide us, to keep people from coming together in a struggle against them. Because they know that together we will win!
